ECU00003283 - APPLICATION FOR SECTION 36 CONSENT AND DIRECTION FOR DEEMED PLANNING PERMISSION UNDER SECTION 57(2) OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (SCOTLAND) ACT 1997

This covering letter along with the supporting documents listed below, comprise an application made under section 36 of the Electricity Act 1989 (as amended), made by RWE Renewables UK Onshore Wind Limited (the Applicant), for:

- 1) A section 36 consent for a new wind farm generating in excess of 50MW (The 'Proposed Development'): and
- 2) A Direction under section 57(2) of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997 (the "1997 Act") that deemed planning permission be granted.

Site Location and Boundary

The Development Site is located mainly in Dumfries and Galloway with a small proportion of it being located in East Ayrshire between Carsphairn (located approximately 11km to the south west) and Sanquhar (located approximately 12.3km to the north east). The National Grid Reference (NGR) for the Site centre is E266000 N601400.

The location and Site boundary for the Proposed Development is shown on Figure 1.1 of the EIA Report (copy enclosed as Appendix 1).

The Proposed Development

The Applicant is seeking consent for:

- Up to 15 wind turbines
- Development connecting infrastructure elements;
- Access from B729 and C class road (Lorg road);
- Hard standing areas e.g. crane pads and storage areas;

- Borrow pit (s) (to be located within the borrow pit search areas);
- Two 'permanent' anemometer mast of up to 100m to monitor weather conditions;
- Temporary works i.e. two construction compounds and gatehouse; and
- On-site electrical infrastructure including a wind farm control building and a Scottish Power Energy Networks (SPEN) 132/33kV substation A and a SPEN 33kV substation B and underground cabling between these buildings and the turbines.

Planning Fees

We understand that the fee for an application under Section 36 of the Electricity Act to construct, extend or operate a generating station which is EIA development (exceeding 50MW but not exceeding 100MW) is £125,000. The application fee has been paid by the Applicant under the reference ECU00003283.

The registered office of The Applicant is Greenwood House, Westwood Way, Coventry, CV4 8PB and WSP E&IS Limited are the lead EIA consultant for the Proposed Development.

On the basis of the information provided in this application and in the supporting documents (including the Environmental Impact Assessment Report) the Applicant requests that the Scottish Ministers grant the application for section 36 consent subject to such other directions or conditions as the Scottish Ministers may see fit.



Notice is hereby given that RWE Renewables UK Onshore Wind Ltd company registration number 03758407, with its Registered Office at Greenwood, Westwood Business Park, Coventry, CV4 8PB has applied to the Scottish Ministers for consent under Section 36 of the Electricity Act 1989 to construct and operate a wind farm known as Lorg, 12.3km south west of Sanquhar and 11km north east of Carsphairn. [East Ayrshire and Dumfries and Galloway Council area] (Central Grid Reference 266700, 600800).

The installed capacity of the proposed generating station would be over 50MW comprising 15 turbines with a maximum ground to blade tip height of 200 metres and has been subject to Environmental Impact Assessment. An EIA Report has been produced to accompany the application for consent.

RWE Renewables UK Onshore Wind Ltd has also applied for a direction under Section 57(2) of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997 that planning permission for the development be deemed to be granted.

As a result of a statutory objection from the relevant planning authority, or where Scottish Ministers decide to exercise their discretion to do so, Scottish Ministers can also cause a Public Local Inquiry (PLI) to be held.

Following examination of the environmental information, Scottish Ministers will determine the application for consent in two ways:

- Consent the proposal, with or without conditions attached; or Reject the proposal
- **General Data Protection Regulations**
