Preface

In December 2009, RWE npower submitted an application to the Department of Energy and Climate Change, for consent, under Section 36 of The Electricity Act, for a new power station at Willington in Derbyshire. The proposed new power station (known as Willington C Power Station or WCPS) is gas fired and this scoping request relates to the gas pipeline to link it to the National Transmission System (NTS), which is the existing arterial system of large gas transmission pipelines, operated by National Grid.

The Willington C Gas Pipeline (WCGP) will require consent under The Planning Act 2008 and EIA will be required under The Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2009. A feature of this planning regime is the requirement on the applicant to carry out a pre-application consultation.

This Consent Strategy Document explains the route that RWE npower intends to follow during the 'pre-application' stage that will culminate in the submission of an application to The Infrastructure Planning Commission.

1. Introduction

1.1 Context of the Willington C Gas Pipeline

- 1.1.1. In December 2009, RWE npower submitted an application to the Department of Energy and Climate Change for consent under Section 36 of The Electricity Act. This related to a new gas fired power station on the site of the former Willington A and B power stations.
- 1.1.2. The Willington C Gas Pipeline (WCGP) is required to provide fuel for the Willington C Power Station (WCPS) and will be a dedicated pipeline starting at a connection to the National Transmission System.

2. Purpose of Document

2.1 The Purpose of the Strategy Document

- 2.1.1. The purpose of this document is to define the strategy that is proposed for the consenting of the WCGP. This document does not form part of the Statement of Community Consultation (SOCC) and should be treated as a separate document.
- 2.1.2. This document should be read in conjunction with the following documents (all of which, except the first which is appended to this document, are available on the WCPS website, www.rwenpower.com/willington) –
 - WCGP S42 Statutory and Non-Statutory Consultee Lists (appended to this document)
 - WCGP Statement of Community Consultation (SOCC)
 - WCGP EIA Scoping Report
 - WCGP Project Details Document
 - WCGP Preliminary Environmental Information
 - Willington Power Station Gas Supply, Environmental Appraisal Report (Mouchel 04/02/10)
 - Willington Power Station Gas Supply, Route Corridor Selection Report (Mouchel 02/11/09)
- 2.1.3. The WCGP will require a Development Consent Order (DCO) under The Planning Act 2008 and is likely to be one of the first such projects that the public and the consultees will encounter. This document will be made publicly available in order to inform the public and consultees of the process that RWE npower intends to follow in order to obtain consent and explain the stages of the new consenting process.

3. Main Consent Requirements

3.1 The Planning Act 2008

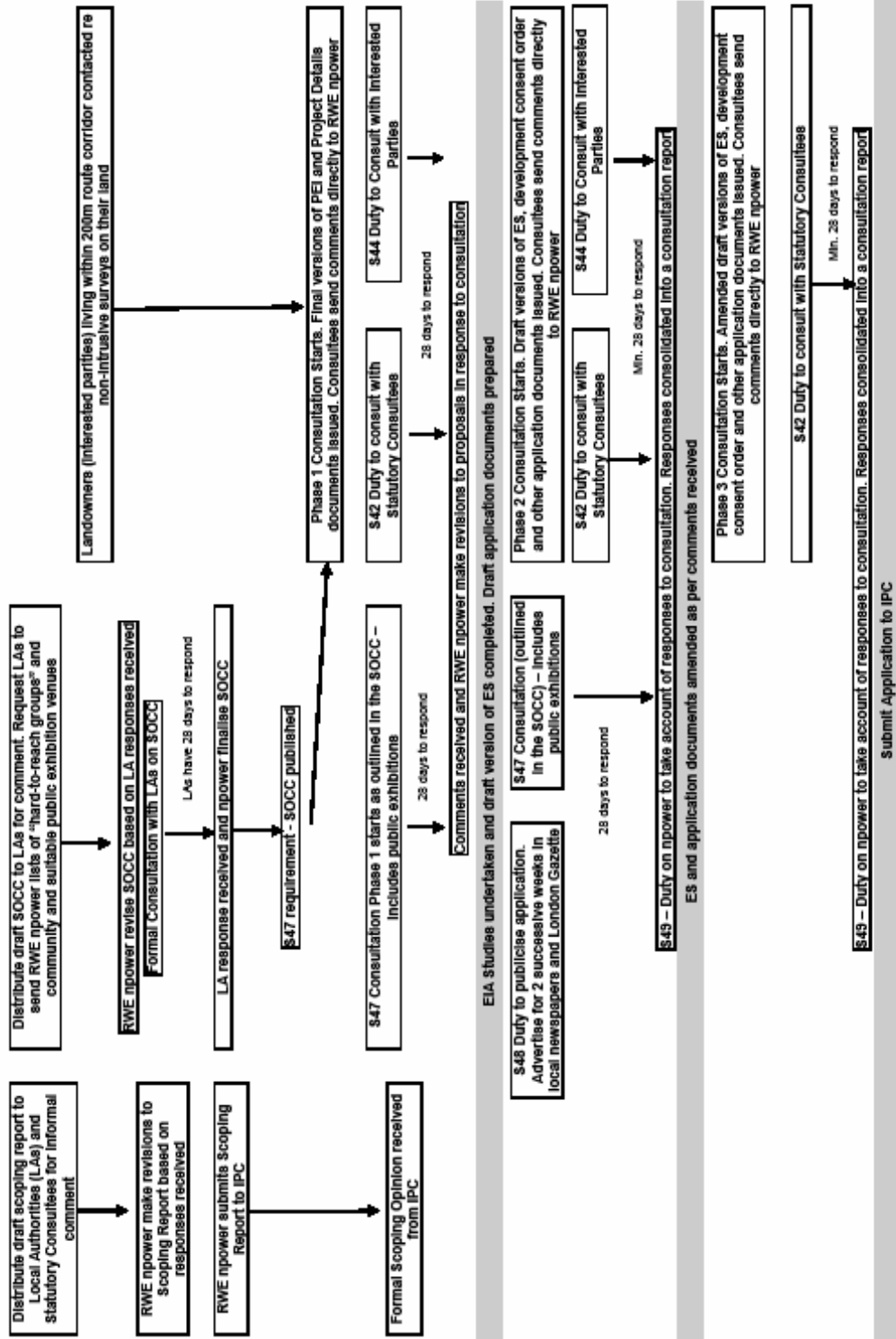
- 3.1.1. The Willington C Gas Pipeline falls within the scope of the Planning Act 2008, administered by The Infrastructure Planning Commission, (IPC) which has been set up to administer the consenting process for 'Nationally Significant Infrastructure Projects'. The flow diagram on page 7 highlights the pre-application stages in the consent process.
- 3.1.2. The proposal will require Infrastructure Development Consent (in the form of a Development Consent Order or DCO), under the Planning Act 2008. This type of pipeline, which would previously have required 'Pipeline Construction Authorisation' under the Pipelines Act (1962), is referred to in Section 21 (other pipelines).
- 3.1.3. This consenting process involves pre-application consultation on all application documents and it is envisaged that a Draft Environmental Statement (ES), along with draft application documents will form the basis of the main pre-application consultation exercise to be carried out in Q4 2010 / Q1 2011. The application is likely to be submitted to the Infrastructure Planning Commission in Q4 2011 following a final pre-application consultation.
- 3.1.4. The application will be assessed by the commission against the following National Policy Statements –
 - EN1 – Draft Overarching National Policy Statement for Energy (November 2009)
 - EN4 – Draft National Policy Statement for Gas Supply Infrastructure and Gas and Oil Pipelines (November 2009)
- 3.1.5. At the time of writing this report, these NPSs are in draft and the IPC could only make a recommendation to the Secretary of State (SoS) who would authorise the project. Once the NPSs are approved, the DCO could be issued by the IPC, however, political changes may require the final decision to be made by the SoS.
- 3.1.6. It is assumed that the application for a Development Consent Order will include an application for deemed planning permission.
- 3.1.7. Further information and guidance regarding the process can be found on the IPC website - <http://infrastructure.independent.gov.uk/>. Table 1 overleaf shows the Willington C Gas Pipeline pre-application consent stages

3.2 The Infrastructure Planning (EIA) Regulations (2009)

- 3.2.1. Applications under the Planning Act 2009 are required to comply with The Infrastructure Planning (EIA) Regulations 2009 - http://www.opsi.gov.uk/si/si2009/uksi_20092263_en_1

- 3.2.2. RWE npower will make an application to the IPC for a direction regarding a scoping opinion under Section 8 of these Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations. The objective of the scoping exercise is to ensure that all potentially significant environmental impacts are identified so that they can be properly assessed. and is part of an application to the IPC requests an opinion on the scope of environmental issues that consultees believe may lead to potentially significant environmental impacts that should be assessed within the EIA.
- 3.2.3. The proposed scope of the EIA for the WCGP is detailed in the 'Wilmington C Gas Pipeline Scoping Report' on the WCGP area of the WCPS website.

4. Pre-consultation Engagement

4.1 Engagement Overview

- 4.1.1. In advance of the commencement of the formal consultation process, RWE npower will engage with local authorities, interested parties, key consultees and local stakeholders. This early activity will help to clarify the overall consenting process, ensure that consultees understand the proposed process that RWE npower intends to follow and have an input into the scope of the consultation process.

4.2 Engagement with Local Authorities (LAs)

- 4.2.1. RWE npower has met with officers of Derbyshire and Staffordshire County Councils, South Derbyshire District Council, East Staffordshire Borough Council and Lichfield District Council.
- 4.2.2. Each local authority has been given a briefing presentation on the project.
- 4.2.3. RWE npower discussed the proposed consenting strategy and in particular the proposed arrangements for the consultation process with statutory consultees.
- 4.2.4. The LAs were sent copies of the draft SOCC, EIA scoping report and this consent strategy document for comment by the end of April 2010.
- 4.2.5. A joint meeting was convened early in April with all the LAs to discuss the SOCC, consenting strategy and EIA scoping. The IPC made a separate presentation to the LAs regarding the Infrastructure Planning process as part of their 'outreach programme'.
- 4.2.6. The local authorities were asked to provide lists of non-statutory consultees.

4.3 Local Authority 'sign off' of the 'Statement of Community Consultation' (SOCC)

- 4.3.1. Following the joint review meeting referred to above, the draft SOCC will be amended and circulated to the LAs for final approval. The SOCC proposes a program of community consultation in accordance with the requirements of S47 of the Act.

4.4 Advertisement of the SOCC

- 4.4.1. RWE npower will publicise the SOCC in accordance with the requirements of S46(a) and finalise it following the due date. The final SOCC will be kept on the WCGP area of the WCPS website, where it will be publically accessible.

4.5 Engagement with key EIA Scoping Consultees

- 4.5.1. In advance of submitting a formal scoping application, RWE npower has met or consulted with the following key scoping consultees –
- Derbyshire County Council
 - South Derbyshire District Council
 - Staffordshire County Council
 - East Staffordshire Borough Council
 - Lichfield District Council
 - Derbyshire Wildlife Trust
 - Staffordshire Wildlife Trust

- The Environment Agency
- Natural England
- English Heritage

Following receipt of the informal scoping responses from the key consultees, RWE npower will review and update the scoping report in advance of formal scoping.

4.6. Submission of an EIA Scoping Application

- 4.6.1. RWE npower will submit a scoping application to the IPC (under Section 8 of the EIA Regs) and a notification that a screening opinion is not required.
- 4.6.2. RWE npower will advise the IPC that there is no likely significant effect upon any European site.
- 4.6.3. The IPC will consult all parties on the Statutory Consultee list and respond to RWE npower within 42 days.

4.7. Engagement with Interested Parties

- 4.7.1. RWE npower's land agents will contact all owners and occupiers of the land within the indicative gas pipeline route corridor. A corridor is being used in order to provide flexibility in the choice of the final route. A 'Book of Reference' will be created that will identify all interested parties within this zone. Consent will be sought for access to land to carry out environmental survey work.

4.8. Engagement with Stakeholders

- 4.8.1. Following the announcement of the project, RWE npower will commence its program of engagement with the local community. In the early stages which will be in advance of the implementation of the SOCC, this will probably take the form of a press release to local newspapers.
- 4.8.2. Parish councils and councillors representing areas affected by the pipeline corridor will be contacted so that they are aware of and informed regarding the proposals.

5. Phase 1 Consultation - Consultations on the Preliminary Information

5.1 Phase 1 Consultation Overview

- 5.1.1. During this stage, the consultation, with all parties, will be based upon the indicative gas pipeline route corridor, Preliminary Environmental Information (PEI) and Draft Project Details.

5.2 Notification to the IPC

- 5.2.1. RWE npower will notify the IPC (in accordance with S46) that it is proposing making an application for a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project and that it intends to commence consultation (under S42). RWE npower will supply the IPC with copies of all the proposed consultation material.
- 5.2.2. The notification will advise the IPC that an ES is proposed.

5.3. The Willington C Power Station Website

5.3.1. The following information will be provided on the Willington C Gas Pipeline area of the Willington C CCGT Power Station website and be made publicly available, in order to inform the initial stages of pre-application consultation. The website address is www.rwenpower.com/willington.

5.3.2. RWE npower will provide documents in order to inform the consultation process. The main vehicle for these documents will be the Willington C Power Station website. RWE npower will request that the LAs make hard copies available to the public at suitable locations. Non-technical summaries will be sent (in hard copy) to the parish councils. The consultation response form will identify the areas that RWE npower wishes to consult upon and specific topics that it requires the consultees to consider. Separate consultation processes will be carried out with Statutory Consultees (S42) with the community (S47) and interested parties (S44). It is likely that the three individual consultation statements will be combined into a single Consultation Report which will become part of the final application for consent.

5.4. Means of Consultation

5.4.1. For consultations under S42 (statutory and interested parties), RWE npower will write to the consultees inviting them to view the consultation documents on the Willington website and download a consultation response form. Hard copies of consultation documents will be made available at local authority offices. A freepost envelope will be available for those without internet access to post their comments back to RWE npower.

5.4.2. For consultations under S47 (Community Consultations), the means of consultation are detailed in the SOCC.

5.5. Implementation of the SOCC

5.5.1. RWE npower will commence the first stages of community consultation process, as detailed in the SOCC.

5.6. EIA

5.6.1. Following EIA scoping, RWE npower will undertake EIA studies to inform the choice of route and undertake an assessment of the impacts of the project. The results of the EIA will be presented in the Environmental Statement (ES) which will be included in the second phase of consultations.

5.7. Landowner Negotiations

- 5.7.1. Following studies, the preferred pipeline route will be confirmed and RWE npower will negotiate with landowners in order to secure the necessary rights to install the pipeline.

6. Pre-application Consultation Phase 2 – Consultations on the Draft Application

6.1. Provision of the Draft Application Documents

- 6.1.1. The second stage consultation will be a consultation on the draft application documents, including the draft EIA. At this stage it will be possible to consider the detail of the proposed pipeline route and the environmental impacts associated with it. In advance of commencement of this stage, the application documents will be prepared and made publically available on the WCPS website.

- 6.1.2. The second consultation will be made on the draft application, which will include -

- The Draft Environmental Statement
- The Draft Project Details Documents
- The Draft Development Order
- The Draft Book of Reference & the Compulsory Rights Order (if applicable)
- Statement of impacts on Statutory Sites/Habitats Assessment (none anticipated)
- The Draft Statement of Common Ground
- The Draft Development Commitments (Planning Conditions)
- The Draft Consultation Statement

6.2. Publicising the Proposed Application

- 6.2.1. RWE npower will publicise the fact that they propose making an application in accordance with the requirements of S48(1) and also that they are submitting an Environmental Statement. The publicity details will comply with the relevant regulations, stating where information is available to be seen and giving a deadline for comments. The timing of the publicity may be reviewed and may be deferred until immediately prior to the submission of the application to prevent this giving rise to other publicity associated with the SOCC.

6.3. Phase 2 Consultation

The second stage consultation will be a consultation on the draft application documents, including the draft EIA and will include the following consultations.

6.4. Phase 2 Community Consultation

- 6.4.1. RWE npower will implement the second stage of the SOCC which will include the provision of information, public exhibitions of the proposals, the necessary publicity and opportunity to comment. This will include a formal consultation under S47.

6.5. Phase 2 Local Authority Consultation and Statutory Consultees

- 6.5.1. RWE npower will continue to liaise with local authorities regarding any potential issues that give rise to concerns. Proposals for planning conditions to address areas of concern and to secure mitigation measures will be drafted. A Statement of

Common Ground will be prepared to document where agreement has been reached over issues.

- 6.5.2. The formal consultation under S42 with local authorities and other statutory consultees will be repeated to complete the consultation process and formal comments received to be incorporated into the consultation statement, statement of common ground and statement of development commitments.

6.6. Phase 2 Interested Parties Consultation

- 6.6.1. RWE npower will formally consult all interested parties (S44) on the draft application.

7. Finalisation and Submission of the Application

7.1. Finalisation of the Application Documents

- 7.1.1. Following the completion of the second stage of consultation, all the draft application documents and the ES will be finalised. This will involve consolidating all the consultation responses into a consultation report and documenting how issues raised during consultation have been resolved or how these issues are linked to planning conditions.

7.2. Final Consultation

- 7.2.1. It is likely that environmental survey information, which was not available during the Phase 2 consultation, will be included in the consolidated ES. In order that the consultation process has included everything that is included in the final application, it is likely that a final consultation will be carried out immediately prior to submission.

7.3. Application Process

- 7.3.1. The necessary forms for the application are defined by regulation. The application will be made to the Infrastructure Planning Commission for a Development Consent Order under The Planning Act 2008.
- 7.3.2. The application assessment criteria that will be applied to the application is explained in the NPS.
