Counter-motion by Mr. Bernd Kevesligeti in relation to the Annual General Meeting of RWE Aktiengesellschaft on 28 April 2022:

Counter-motion in accordance to Sections 125 and 126 regarding the Annual General Meeting of RWE Aktiengesellschaft on April 28, 2022

The acts of the Executive Board and the Supervisory Board should not be approved.

RWE continues to pursue its misguided coal policy. Contrary to the vociferously postulated climate goals. The company generates some 20 percent of its electricity from nuclear fuel, 36 percent from lignite and 7 percent from hard coal (according to statista). RWE has filed a lawsuit against the coal phaseout in the Netherlands, in which it is suing for two billion euros in compensation for two power stations.

In addition, RWE does not mind that localities in the Rhenish mining region will still have to be evacuated in the future and their residents will be forced to relocate.

Names of villages that have existed for hundreds of years such as Berverath, Westrich, Kuckum, Keyenberg und Immerath are an expression of this policy. People have to make way for coal (or the profit carried forward).
